#### **Pastoral Transition**

As was announced by Cindy Borgstrom last month, Pastor Teaira has been reappointed and will be moving to California to pastor the United Methodist Church in San Fernando. We will be getting a new pastor effective July 1<sup>st</sup> which is the date most pastoral transitions are made.

This past Sunday, Don MacMillan, representing the Scholarship Committee, presented three of our graduating high school seniors with scholarships. # A Note from the Counting Committee

Over the past year we have implemented a new process to count the tithes and offerings given each week through the offering plate. This process is more efficient in terms of both the time needed for counting and in recording



your gifts to the church. The process also makes it easier for us to record gifts for multiple items that come in on one check. In the past, we requested separate envelopes and checks for each item, but now those can all be combined in one check. We know checks are expensive and this will help reduce the number of checks you write to the church. Here are some guidelines:

- Please do not tape your envelope shut. The glue on the envelope is sufficient to keep it closed until it gets to the counters.
- Please be sure your envelope number is on your check and on anything you use to submit gifts to the church if not your assigned envelopes. There is no need to include your name on the outside of the envelope—everything is tracked by number.
- 3. If you want to write one check for multiple items (ex., weekly offering, communion, flowers, donation to the scholarship fund), please just write on the outside of your envelope how the money in the check should be split between those items and we will record it that way.
- 4. We appreciate that some of you are now using electronic means to make your contributions to the church. If you have an option, please select the e-check or ACH option instead of credit card as that incurs a lower fee (paying electronically does have a cost associated with it which you can choose to cover, but if you do not, the church pays it and that cost is lower with ACH than credit cards).

However you contribute to the church, and whatever you contribute to the church, thank you!

## **Noisy Coins**

What is our 'Noisy Coin' collection?

Several years ago, Marsha Danser heard an idea from another church about how they were raising funds for their Sunday School program and she brought it to Broad Street.

Thanks to our members and friends, it has been a very effective fundraiser here.

Once a month from September through May, the youth take a special offering in metal offering plates (so that coins, when put in, are 'noisy'). Not everyone puts in coins and bills are appreciated as well. The money is counted separately from the regular offering and is used to fund our Sunday School. The average monthly Noisy Coin collection is \$50 so that goes a long way towards supporting the cost of our Sunday School. Thank you!

### Recent Fundraisers and Projects



At the end of March we held our first ever hoagie sale. We did not have any experience in doing this, but Michele Hogan reached out to a relative who was involved in a similar fundraiser at a local fire company and got the details. Using that information, Michele and Laura

Jaskot put together the fundraiser and with the help of about 10 women, we pre-sold 105 hoagies and made them on a Friday and Saturday morning in late March.

The sale was very successful, raising over \$600 for the church and we decided to hold another one in early June a few weeks ago. Michele had the idea of combining a fundraiser for the church with outreach to our local first responders, so we had a 'buy one, give one' program where people could buy a hoagie for themselves and then for a smaller fee, donate a hoagie to a first responder.

Again the program was successful resulting in donations of three large trays of hoagies to the Burlington City Police Department, the Endeavor Emergency Squad and Burlington Township's Fire Station 301 on the Burlington Bypass. We raised over \$450 for the church as well. Thanks to everyone who purchased hoagies, who donated hoagies and who helped make the hoagies—you all made the program a great success. Look for our next hoagie sale in mid-September.



Another recent fundraiser had a number of people working in the gym to take the wooden seats off our old chairs so that we could bring the metal frames to a **metal recycler** where we could get paid by the pound for the metal.

A dedicated crew removed the seats while others went through the gym looking for other metal items that could be removed and recycled.

Three or four pick-up trucks took loads to the recycler and we earned just under \$100 and cleaned out the gym at the same time. Thanks to everyone for their hard work!





Michele Hogan also recently organized groups of youth looking for community service hours (high school honor society youth as well as scouts) and they spent some time in our cemetery cleaning out brush and generally making the property look much nicer. Thanks so much for your effort—it looks great!



We collected a lot of items thanks to everyone's donations and Michele Hogan organized youth to come and volunteer to put the bags together.

Some of the Blessing Bags were donated to the Meals of Love program at the Beverly UMC. Recently, others were brought across the street to the Baptist Church to hand out with the groceries in their food program. Marsha Danser reported that the bags were very well received by those who participate in that program and everyone was very appreciative and excited to receive things like soap, a toothbrush and toothpaste, shampoo and the other items in the bags. Thank you to everyone who donated or helped put the bags together. You made a difference!
