Cindy has played a major roll in helping coordinate our group, United Women in Faith (UWF) with the Girls of Grace (GOG) group.

With the two groups working together, we will be better able to meet our mission goals, which include contributing to the International United Women in Faith for global missions, focusing primarily on women, children and youths needs.

Nationally and locally we support mission work that is a little closer to home. Nationally, our group has collected vegetable seeds every March, to send to an organization here in the United States that provides what is needed for low income families to plant, grow and harvest much of their own food.,

Our local missions provide support for the Camden Neighborhood Center whose services include educational, recreational and basic needs, serving children and youth in the Camden, NJ area. Locally, we also support special needs that may come up from storms or other disasters. Examples would be donating supplies or providing hands on help for clean up and restoration in local areas that are affected. We also provide support to our own church for non-budgeted items. In the past that has included emergency repairs to something within our own church, and assisting with financial support for our youth to attend conferences and/or educational programs.

Mark your calendars now and tell your friends and family: Gerald Dickens is returning to Broad Street UMC on Black Friday, November 24, 2023, for two performances, 1PM and 7PM. What a wonderful day to start the holiday season with our annual Thanksgiving Breakfast the day before and perhaps some holiday shopping that morning.



Exciting news: a writer from NJ Monthly magazine reached out. She is featuring Burlington as a good place to visit for a day or an overnight stay and her article is going to mention our performances of *A Christmas Carol*. The article covers a lot of the things to do and see in Burlington and we are really excited that she included us. This year we are going to try and include some ads from local businesses in our program as a way to help offset the costs. We get 250-300 people on average at his performances and other groups with that audience size are able to sell quite a few ads in their programs. We have a form that can be given to local businesses. We will be looking for people to help with the shows including setting up the sanctuary before the program, selling tickets, taking tickets at the door, running the elevator, directing people through the building, handing out programs, baking for our reception, setting up and cleaning up the receptions and putting the sanctuary back in order after the evening performance. We have always gotten great compliments on our receptions—everyone really enjoys talking after the performances and everyone who has helped with them in the past should be very proud of the comments we've received.

Tickets are available now. They are \$20/adults and \$18/students and seniors in advance. All tickets are \$20 at the door. While other venues charge more for their tickets to Gerald's performances, we try and keep the ticket prices affordable recognizing that a large portion of our audience are people on fixed incomes and we want to ensure they can still enjoy a program of this quality.

September Clothing Drive Fundraiser

We are going to hold our first ever clothing drive fundraiser in the month of September. An organization in Princeton Junction collects and pays by the pound for the following: Adult & Children Clothing, Shoes, Handbags, Purses, Sandals, Sneakers, Boots, Jackets, Coats, Rain Gear, Leathers, Belts, Ties, Pants, Shirts, Sweaters, Vests, Blouses, Dresses, Skirts, Robes, Undergarments, Sheets, Pillowcases, Towels, Linens, Tablecloths, Hats, Scarfs, Gloves, Wallets, Jewelry, Watches, Uniforms, and Jerseys. Merchandise that has holes, rips, stains, mold or has an odor and is wet is not accepted.

This works out well because we don't collect or sell clothes at our yard sale. As you go through your summer clothing at the end of the year and start taking out your winter clothing, put aside and bag up anything that you no longer wear and bring it to church. We will collect through the month of September and then bring the collected items to the Princeton Junction location and earn some money for the church.

According to their website, "the items collected from your fundraising programs go to regions in the USA as well as abroad to be sent to low income areas at economical prices and given a second chance. Inform your participants that they are helping your organization create awareness in the community, raising funds, cleaning out their homes, and giving back to low income areas! It's a quadruple win! "
