Second Week of Advent

5 - Day Devotional

Week of December 1, 2024

## **Devotional Summary:**

This 5-day Advent devotional, based on Luke 3:1–6, invites readers to reflect on John the Baptist's call to prepare the way for the Lord. Through repentance, realignment of priorities, and faithfilled anticipation, this series leads individuals to prepare their hearts for the coming of Christ. Each day includes scripture focus, reflection, and practical application for the Advent season.

## Day 1: Hear the Call to Prepare

Scripture: Luke 3: 2b-3

**Reflection**: God's call to John the Baptist was clear: prepare people's hearts for the coming of Jesus. John preached repentance—a turning away from sin and toward God. As we begin this Advent journey, we're invited to do the same. Preparing for Christ starts with listening for God's voice in our lives. Are we attuned to His call?

**Prayer:** Lord, help me hear Your voice as clearly as John did. Reveal anything in my life that separates me from You. Grant me the courage to repent and turn toward You in faith. Amen.

**Action Step:** Spend 10 minutes in silence today, asking God to reveal areas of your life that need change. Write down what comes to mind, and pray for His guidance to take the first step toward repentance.

# Day 2: Clear the Obstacles

Scripture: Luke 3:4

**Reflection**: Advent reminds us to examine our hearts for anything that hinders our relationship with God. Distractions, unresolved conflicts, and misplaced priorities can block the path of Christ entering our lives. What obstacles might be keeping you from experiencing His peace?

**Prayer:** Lord, I invite You to walk through my heart and help me clear away anything that obstructs my relationship with You. Make my life a straight path for Your presence. Amen.

**Action Step:** Identify one specific obstacle—such as busyness, unconfessed sin, or a strained relationship—that needs attention. Take a step today to address it, whether through prayer, conversation, or a deliberate change in routine.

## Day 3: Level the Mountains

Scripture: Luke 3:5

**Reflection:** Sometimes, pride or self-reliance becomes a "mountain" that blocks our view of God. Advent is a time to humble ourselves, recognizing our need for Jesus. By leveling these mountains, we prepare our hearts to receive Him fully.

**Prayer:** Lord, I confess that I sometimes rely on my own strength instead of Yours. Help me to humble myself and trust in Your wisdom and provision. Teach me to walk in humility each day. Amen.

**Action Step:** Find a small way to practice humility today. This could be serving someone in need, listening to another's perspective, or admitting where you've been wrong.

# Day 4: Trust in God's Promise

Scripture: Luke 3:6

**Reflection**: John's message pointed to a promise: salvation through Jesus Christ, available to all people. Trusting in this promise fills us with hope and reminds us of God's unchanging faithfulness. As we wait for Christ's coming, we can live in confident hope, knowing His salvation is for us and those around us.

**Prayer:** Lord, thank You for the gift of salvation through Jesus Christ. Help me trust in Your promises and share Your hope with others this Advent season. Amen.

**Action Step:** Share God's love and hope with someone today. It could be a kind gesture, a listening ear, or sharing how God has worked in your life.

# Day 5: Embracing a New Beginning

Scripture: Luke 2Luke 3:3

**Reflection**: Repentance leads to forgiveness, and forgiveness opens the door to new life in Christ. As Advent comes to a close, reflect on how God's grace has given you a fresh start. Preparing for Christ is not just a seasonal exercise—it's a lifelong transformation.

**Prayer:** Lord, thank You for the forgiveness that comes through Your Son, Jesus. Help me to embrace the new beginning You offer and to live each day in Your grace. Amen.

**Action Step:** Write a prayer of gratitude, thanking God for His forgiveness and the new life you have in Him. Commit to carrying the lessons of Advent into the days ahead.
