The Christian calendar begins with Advent. Last Sunday, Christ the King Sunday, was the final Sunday in the Christian year. Now we wait. Here's a statement from Discipleship Ministries about the beginning of Advent:

"Stop. Take a moment. Breathe deeply. We have arrived—again—at the beginning of the journey. That's the strange thing about this season. Advent sits us down in the liminal space of God's already-and-not-yet kingdom and asks us to wait. ... Now, if you're around young children for any length of time, you will be reminded that waiting is very hard. ... Perhaps this is the role of Advent— to teach us to pay attention and figure out what is ours to do as we faithfully wait for the birth of the Christ child and the fulfillment of God's kingdom."
